SHOE BOX MINISTRY

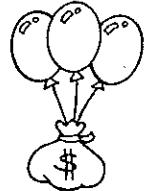

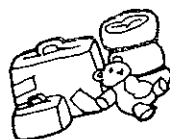
NEXT SUMMER:

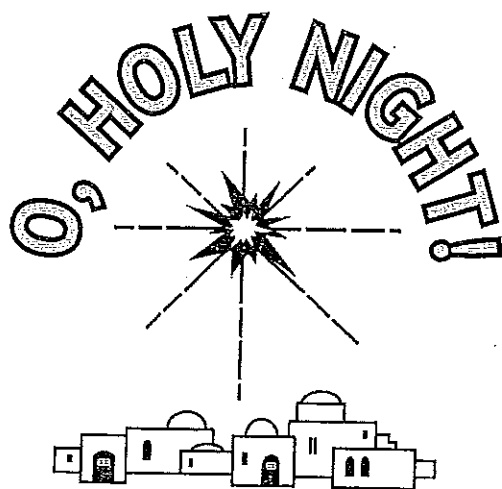
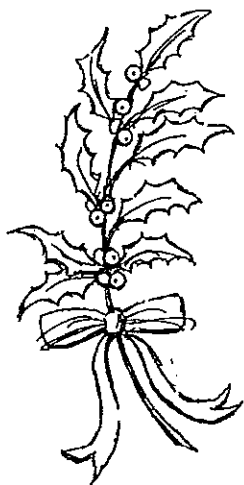

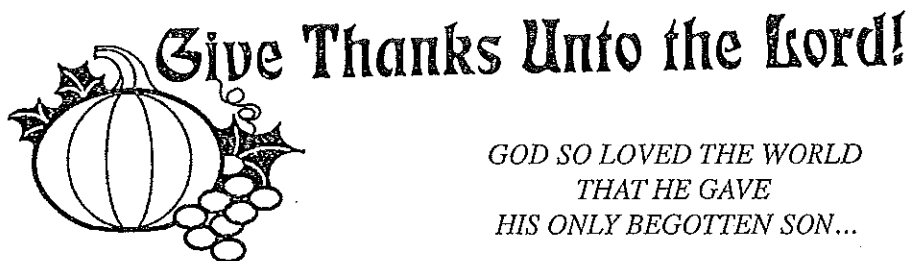
